ICVP ORGANIZED FIRST COURSE ON 'DESCRIPTIVE VETERINARY PATHOLOGY OF THE ARMED FORCES INSTITUTE OF PATHOLOGY' IN INDIA

Indian College of Veterinary Pathologists (ICVP) conducted FIRST International Course on 'Descriptive Veterinary Pathology' in India (in fact in Asia) held from 2-6 April 2010 jointly with Vimta Laboratories at their Life Sciences Facility, Genome Valley, Hyderabad.

The course was jointly sponsored by Armed Forces Institute of Pathology, Washington DC USA and Charles Louis Davis DVM Foundation of USA. Bruce H. Williams, DVM, DACVP, President of the Foundation, directed the course along with Paul Stromberg, Professor of Pathology, Ohio State University. The same faculty also conducts courses in US & Europe for over a decade. The course was attended by 57 Veterinary Pathologists from diverse areas of practice including universities, institutions and industry. The 40 hours course spread over five days included descriptive veterinary pathology training on gross pathology, macro-micro correlation,

histopatholgy, electron microscopy; cytology, immunohistochemistry, clinical biochemistry, clinical pathology, blood gas analysis with clinical & pathologic correlation.

The course was inaugurated by Dr Amir Hamza, Associate Dean, College of Veterinary Sciences at Secundrabad whereas Dr AN Ramaswami, President Life Sciences Division of Vimta Labs was the Guest of Honour. Dr Lal Krishna, President ICVP & IAVP, Animal Husbandry Commissioner GOI, and ADG (AH) ICAR, and Dr S.P. Vasireddi, Chairman & Managing Director of VIMTA Labs graced the closing ceremony.
